Workshopweathering clinic

Real trains spend years out in the elements and many show signs of this long and hard service life. So Roger Caiazza decided to show us his techniques of weathering to make our trains look more realistic. We each brought a car to try out his artistry.

Weathering of rolling stock can take many forms Roger explained; rust, grime, faded letters and paint. There are almost as many ways to recreate the ravages of time and nature, but Roger prefers, and has perfected, the use of plain old "chalk." Weathering can be intimidating, but not impossible as Guy and Kathie Garnsey, Michael Prell, John Spencer, and Carl Cramer found out.

Roger explained the steps and commented that with practice, you'll be adding years of realism to your rolling stock in no time with pastel chalks. Pastel chalks are great for weathering.

- Using a mild grit sandpaper, scrape the chalk stick into a fine powder.
- Dip a brush or sponge into the powder and then dab or brush the chalk onto the surface to be weathered.

Roger explained that drab orange and brown mixtures simulate rust around fasteners. Black can be used to create the illusion of soot from smoke stacks.

After Roger's instructions and all of our hard work weathering our rolling stock, we were amazed at the artist that was found within. All who attended enjoyed the evening and the education as well as the "train chat" that occurred.
