## Garnsey Train Gardens

### **Garnsey Layout**

On June 20th, Guy and Kathie Garnsey opened their layout to club members. Guy and Kathie live out in Scipio Center south of Auburn off Route 34. My father-in-law and I took the ride out on that Saturday afternoon to get a look at this large layout. Upon arriving, we were greeted by the Garnseys and were treated to a personal tour of the layout and their sprawling property, which includes a large wood working shop and a stable/riding arena for Kathie's love or horses.

You can see by the pictures that Guy is a master woodworker by the buildings and bridges he's produced. Many of the buildings he's made are replicas of actual structures in and around the Scipio Center area. Guy's railroad is predominantly 1/20.3 "F" scale and the motive power is battery operated. The stonework used to produce the viaduct that takes you around the perimeter of the layout is spectacular. Plantings on the railroad consist of dwarf spruce, seedling cedars from the parent trees in the yard, creeping thyme for ground cover and several types of perennials.

Thanks to Guy and Kathie for opening their home and providing the opportunity to view their gardens. Great job!
